European Project "Int4furn" to Enhance Internationalization Capabilities of Micro-SMEs in the Furniture Sector

Int4furn Project Advances Internationalization Training for Micro-SMEs in the Furniture Sector

The Int4furn project, officially titled "Enhancing Internationalization Capabilities of Micro-SMEs in the Furniture Sector Through ECVET Compliant Innovative Training Course," reached another significant milestone during its fourth transnational meeting held in Zaragoza, Spain. The consortium, comprising seven partners from Turkey, Spain, Italy, Portugal, Estonia, and the Netherlands, convened to finalize the training content that focuses on the internationalisation of micro-SMEs within the furniture sector.



Key Focus of the Zaragoza Meeting

The primary focus of the Zaragoza meeting was the completion of the training content, a crucial part of the project's Work Package 2 (WP2). This work package is dedicated to developing a comprehensive ECVET compliant training course aimed at enhancing the internationalisation capabilities of micro-SMEs in the furniture sector. The main activities under WP2 included:

- Development of a state-of-the-art report
- Curriculum design
- Creation of training courses and materials (each partner contributing at least one module)
- Compilation of a proficiency glossary
- Handbook development
- Translations and piloting



Moreover, significant progress has been made on Work Package 4 (WP4) - the Digital Internationalization Learning Hub. This hub will serve as a central repository for all training courses and materials developed within the project. It will include learning materials from WP2 and a Self-Assessment Tool from WP3. The Digital Internationalization Learning Hub, which will soon be live, offering online and mobile learning platforms for the target audience.

As the Int4furn project moves forward, it remains dedicated to fostering international trade among micro-SMEs and young entrepreneurs. By providing tailored support and innovative training, the project aims to create a sustainable and globally competitive environment for the furniture sector.
