## **European Project "Int4furn" Successfully Concludes with International Pilot Tryouts and Finalized Digital Learning Hub**

### **Int4furn Project Wraps Up with Successful Piloting and Launch of Updated Digital Internationalisation Hub**

The Int4furn project, officially titled *"Enhancing Internationalization Capabilities of Micro-SMEs in the Furniture Sector Through ECVET Compliant Innovative Training Course"*, has reached its final stage, marking the successful conclusion of a two-year journey to strengthen the internationalisation readiness of micro-SMEs in the furniture industry.

#### **Pilot Testing Across Europe**

Following the development of an innovative training curriculum and digital resources, the project entered its pilot phase. Pilot tryouts were conducted across all partner countries—Turkey, Spain, Italy, Portugal, Estonia, the Netherlands, and Greece—with excellent participation and engagement from micro-SMEs, trainers, and young entrepreneurs in the furniture sector.

The piloting phase provided valuable feedback on the training modules, ensuring that the content is practical, accessible, and tailored to the real needs of businesses aiming to expand to international markets.

#### **Finalization of the Digital Internationalisation Learning Hub**

A major highlight of the project is the completion and update of the Digital Internationalisation Learning Hub—a central platform that now offers:

- All seven thematic training modules developed by partners,
- A multilingual proficiency glossary,
- A practical self-assessment tool,
- Supporting materials and resources for learners and trainers.
